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New Hope

New Hope, a funded agency of the Nassau County Department of Mental Health, Chemical Dependency, and Developmental Disabilities Services and NYS Office of Alcohol and Substance Abuse Services, offers a safe, sober environment to chemically dependent individuals and/or individuals who are in a situational crisis as a result of alcohol or substance abuse problems.

Facility

The average stay at New Hope is one-to-two weeks with an overall goal to provide crisis counseling and assistance with linkage to the most appropriate after-care treatment services.

Services

- Health and Chemical Dependency Evaluations
- Wellness and Chemical Dependency Education
- Crisis Counseling
- Self-help, group and individual meetings
- Assistance with linkage
- Transportation provided locally to the next level of care
- Semi-private rooms
- Three meals daily and snacks



Admission Process

Pre-admission screenings are encouraged. It is recommended to contact New Hope by telephone and complete the screening process with a nurse or counselor. This will determine the nature of the crisis and if this unit is the best level of care for the client.

New Hope does accept clients who walk-in without prior screening; however, admission may not be possible if there are no beds available.

Admissions are accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. Beds may not be reserved in advance. Admission is open to both men and women.

You May Bring:

- Shirts & undergarments for five days; one sweatshirt (hoodie) or sweater
- Disposable scrub pants are provided by the program during your stay
- Comb or brush; hair dryer; (females) newly purchased make-up only
- Identification, insurance/Medicaid card, social security card
- Additional clothing may be dropped off the day before discharge to the next level of care
- Electronic devices, including cell phones, are not allowed in your possession
- Contraband, including tobacco products, will be discarded if brought on the unit

Insurance

Generally, insurance is not required to receive services at New Hope. However, in the event insurance information is required for linkage to the next level of care or to fill a prescription, individuals are asked to provide proof of insurance during the admission process.

We may not inform any person or agency of a client's attendance in this program or disclose any information unless consent is obtained in writing. We are obliged to disclose information as determined by a court order or to medical personnel in the event of a medical emergency.
